WBCA announces 2014 Academic Top 25 Team Honor Rolls

ATLANTA (July 24, 2014) - The University of Missouri-Kansas City, Upper Iowa University, Westminster College, Mount Marty College and Snow College are the top honorees in their respective divisions on the WBCA Academic Top 25 Team Honor Rolls for the 2013-14 season, the Women's Basketball Coaches Association announced today.

The WBCA Academic Top 25 annually recognizes NCAA Division I, II and III; NAIA; and junior/community college women's basketball teams across the nation that carry the highest combined grade point average (GPA) inclusive of all student-athletes on their rosters for the entire season. The 2013-14 season is the 19th in which the WBCA has compiled the honor rolls.

The University of Missouri-Kansas City returns to the Academic Top 25 Honor Roll for the second time in program history and for the first time since 1998. Upper lowa makes the list for the second consecutive year and for the fourth time overall. Westminster College (Mo.) took the top spot for NCAA Division III for the first time in program history. Mount Marty College made the list for the 17th time in the award's 19 year history. Snow College leads the Junior/Community College division for the second straight year.

"Being a student-athlete is a challenging feat, but at the same time it is also very rewarding and to see the GPA's that these institutions have collected is impressive," said WBCA COO Shannon Reynolds. "The WBCA congratulates all of these student-athletes and their coaches for their hard work and dedication."

A team's GPA is calculated by dividing the total number of quality points earned by the total number of hours attempted by all team members in the academic terms (semesters or quarters) that the season spans. Weighted grades are converted to a 4.0 scale. The GPA's are rounded to the nearest thousandth of a point. Teams are

nominated for the honor by a WBCA-member head coach. A team must have a 3.000 or better GPA to be nominated.

NCAA Division I

University of Missouri-Kansas City led NCAA Division I with a 3.628 GPA and was one of two institutions from the Western Athletic Conference to make the Academic Top 25 Honor Roll. UMKC finished the season with an 11-19 mark. The Kangaroos' season ended following an 81-76 loss to Seattle in the quarterfinals of the WAC Championship.

Three of the top 25 teams on the Division I WBCA Academic Top 25 honor roll earned a berth in the 2014 NCAA tournament.

NCAA Division II

Upper Iowa University posted a GPA of 3.801 to lead all NCAA Division II programs. The Peacocks ended the season with a 74-73 loss to Minot State University in the NSIC/Sanford Health Basketball Tournament to close the season with a 5-22 record.

Five of the 25 teams that earned a spot on the honor roll advanced to the NCAA

Division II tournament.

Division III

Westminster College (Mo.), the only team from the St. Louis Intercollegiate Athletic Conference to be ranked in the WBCA Academic Top 25 Poll recorded a 3.642 GPA to top the list. After starting the season 2-6 the Blue Jays finished the season 13-12, falling to Spalding 70-64 in the semifinals of the SLIAC Tournament.

Eight programs participated in the NCAA Division III tournament.

NAIA

Mount Marty College, which has appeared in the Academic Top 25 list in the NAIA 16 previous years, comes in at No. 1 for the first time this year with a 3.746 GPA. The Lancers' highest ranking on the list prior to this year was third in 2005. Mount Marty College won three of its final four games including a 76-63 win against Nebraska Wesleyan to close out the season with a 13-17 overall record.

Thirteen of the 25 programs that made the 2014 Academic Top 25 also played in either the NAIA Division I or Division II tournament.
