NCAA Division I Working Group on Transfers - Update

Charge and Timeline.

This group's charge is to fulfill the parameters of the resolution adopted by the NCAA Division I Council in May to develop a comprehensive proposal regarding transfer eligibility to be voted on not later than January 2021 and effective not later than for eligibility to compete during the 2021-22 academic year.

The resolution articulates a framework to achieve a uniform and equitable approach to transfer eligibility, while acknowledging ancillary items that may need adjustment with such changes (e.g., transfer notification date, roster considerations, informed transfer decision-making.

Transfer Eligibility Standards – Areas of Agreement

The following are the Division I Working Group on Transfers' current areas of agreement on a uniform transfer eligibility rule.

- A uniform transfer eligibility exception providing immediate eligibility:
 - <u>should</u> only be available one time during a student-athlete's eligibility (i.e., undergraduate or preserved until postgraduate transfer);
 - <u>should</u> be available any time during the student-athlete's eligibility;
 - <u>should</u> require the student-athlete leave the previous institution academically eligible (percentage-of-degree exception) and maintain academic progress at new institution to be eligible to compete;

Transfer Eligibility Standards – Areas of Agreement, continued.

- <u>should</u> require that the receiving institution guarantee financial aid through completion of the student-athlete's undergraduate degree (i.e., tuition, fees and textbooks);
- <u>should not</u> provide immediate eligibility if used at midyear allowing for representation
 of multiple institutions in athletics competition in the same academic year that
 contributes toward winter or spring championships;
- <u>should not</u> include a provision allowing the previous institution to object to the student-athlete being immediately eligible;
- <u>should not</u> limit the number of transfer student-athletes that an institution may accept on a team in a given year(s);



Transfer Eligibility Standards – Areas of Agreement, continued.

- <u>should</u> require education for the student-athlete to encourage informed decisionmaking regarding the impacts and implications of transferring (e.g., financial aid, graduation); and
- o <u>should</u> require the student-athlete and the head coach at the new institution to certify in writing that impermissible recruiting contact did **not** occur prior to student-athlete's entry into NCAA Transfer Portal.



Notification of Transfer Date – Draft Concept

Draft Concept:

 Fall/winter sports: June 1 or the end of the departing institution's academic year, whichever is later.

Rationale:

- Spring semesters have ended (student-athletes will know their grades/progress toward degree).
- Season-of-competition is completed (natural cooling off period, time for proper decision-making process to take place).
- Majority of head coaching changes have taken place.

Exceptions:

- Head coaching change prior to July 1.
- Financial aid is nonrenewed prior to July 1.



Next Steps

The Working Group on Transfers will:

- Continue to finalize the components of the uniform transfer eligibility proposal and begin to seek membership and stakeholder feedback.
- Develop educational materials including a question and answer document for the proposal.
- Recommend a final comprehensive uniform transfer eligibility proposal no later than the October Council meeting.
