



### 2020-21 Men's and Women's Basketball Season

- Council adopted <u>emergency temporary legislation</u> in the following items:
  - First permissible contest date and preseason practice period.
  - Maximum number of contests.
  - Minimum number of contests for sports sponsorship and regular-season conference competition.
  - Scrimmages and exhibition games prior to the first permissible contest date.

September 21-October 13: Transition period based on first permissible contest date. A maximum of 12 hours per week of strength and conditioning activities, sport-related meetings and skill instruction, with not more than eight hours per week spent on skill instruction, and two days off per week.

October 14-November 24: Preseason practice period based on first permissible contest date. A maximum of 20 hours per week, four hours per day and one day off per week.

November 25, 2020: First permissible contest date.



# First Permissible Contest Date and Preseason Practice Period

### Rationale:

- By November 25, at least 76% of Division I institutions will have concluded their fall term or moved remaining instruction and exams online and not expected to return for in-person instruction until January 2021. By November 20, 43% of Division I campuses will be in this position.
- Provides a window of opportunity to begin contests while many institutions are not conducting in-person classes to help mitigate the risk of contracting COVID-19 in a more controlled and less populated campus environment.
- Anticipates availability of more widespread testing enhancements and rapid results by late November.





## Scrimmages and Exhibition Contests Prior to First Permissible Contest Date

#### Intent:

• For the 2020-21 playing season, teams would be prohibited from participating in any scrimmages or exhibition contests prior to the first permissible date of competition.

### • Rationale:

- Participating in these games may jeopardize institution's ability to participate in countable contests and creates unnecessary risk for student-athletes, coaches and team personnel.
- Anticipates availability of more widespread testing enhancements and rapid results by late November.
- Institutions are not precluded from participating in scrimmages or exhibition contests on or after the first permissible contest date.



### Minimum and Maximum Number of Contests

### **Minimum Number of Contests**

Reduction in the minimum number of contests for sports sponsorship by 50% (i.e., 13 contest minimum).

### **Maximum Number of Contests**

Reduction in the maximum number of contests by four.

### Summary of Basketball Start of Season Actions Taken by Division I Council

Area of Focus	Adopted Application as of September 16 Council Action
Transition Period.	September 21 through October 13, 2020.
Preseason Practice Period.	October 14 through November 24, 2020.
First Permissible Contest Date.	November 25, 2020.
Maximum Number of Contests.	Reduce maximum number of contests by four.
Minimum Number of Contests for Sports Sponsorship.	Reduce minimum number of contests for sports sponsorship by 50% (i.e., 13 contest minimum).
Regular-Season Conference Competition Minimum Requirements for NCAA Division I Championship Automatic Qualification.	Waived for 2020-21 basketball season.
Scrimmages and Exhibition Games.	Prohibited prior to first permissible contest date.

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### NCAA Division I Men's and Women's Basketball Committees

- Teams will meet sport sponsorship requirements and be considered for NCAA championship selection if they play 13 games. For NCAA championship consideration, all 13 games must be against another Division I opponent.
- Committees recommended teams play a minimum of four nonconference games for purposes of NCAA Division I Championship selection.



### **Other Legislative Areas**

 Qualifying Regular-Season Multiple-Team Events (NCAA Bylaws 17.4.5.1.1 and 17.4.5.2.1).

Agreed that qualifying regular season multiple-team events may operate under the normal parameters outlined in the legislation and the current application of qualifying regular season multiple-team events will be maintained.

Three-Day Winter Break Period - Autonomy Legislation (Bylaw 17.1.7.9).

Agreed that this legislation be maintained at this time.
