Ariel Brough Awarded Charles T. Stoner Law Scholarship

ATLANTA, Ga. (March 4, 2010) -- The Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) has selected Ariel Brough of Baldwin-Wallace College as the winner of the Charles T. Stoner Law Scholarship Award. The \$1,000 Charles T. Stoner Law Scholarship Award, named for and presented by Stoner, a former legal consultant for the WBCA, is presented annually to one female collegiate basketball player who intends to pursue a career in law.

"I am happy to present Ariel Brough with the Charles T. Stoner Law Scholarship Award," said WBCA CEO Beth Bass. "We want to thank Ariel for not only her commitment to the game of basketball, but also for her efforts in the classroom as well."

Brough averaged 10.9 points and 6.8 rebounds a game this season. She holds the school single season and career record in blocks. She was named a 2010 ESPN The Magazine third-team Academic All-American. A 6'2" center, Brough maintains a 3.97 GPA in political science and is on the Dean's List. She is a three-time (08-10) ESPN The Magazine First-Team Academic All-District IV selection. Brough is a three-time Academic All-Ohio Athletic Conference choice and a two-time All-OAC selection.

The Powell, Ohio, native served as this year's team captain, holds the career school record for blocked shots with 236 and ranks second all-time in the OAC. During her junior year she set the single-season school record for blocked shots with 80. She helped lead her team to an 87-26 record during her four years with one OAC regular season title, one OAC Tournament title and two appearances in the NCAA Division III National Tournament.

Brough earned the Jacket Scholars Award as a freshman at Baldwin-Wallace and is a member of the Alpha Lambda Delta, Pi Sigma Alpha, and Dayton C. Miller honor societies.

Brough will be formally recognized at the WBCA Awards Luncheon presented by State Farm and Jostens at Noon CT on Tuesday, April 6, at the Marriott Rivercenter Grand Ballroom. This event is part of the WBCA National Convention and is held in conjunction with the NCAA® Women's Final Four® in San Antonio, Texas.
