## North Texas becomes first program to announce plans to hold Whiteboard

ATLANTA (June 12, 2013) – The University of North Texas is the first institution to announce that it will conduct a session of Whiteboard, the new professional development initiative developed jointly by the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) and the National Association of Collegiate Women Athletic Administrators (NACWAA), the WBCA office announced today.

The North Texas Whiteboard session will be held from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. CT on Thursday, Aug. 8. UNT assistant coach Karen Blair will serve as host for the event, which will take place in UNT's coliseum, the "Super Pit," on the school's campus in Denton, Texas. The session is open to coaches of women's basketball on all levels (scholastic and up), but will be limited to 40 persons. There is no fee to attend. Information on how to register to attend the session will be made available soon.

Whiteboard goes beyond X's & O's to provide coaches of women's basketball with a professional education and personal growth opportunity. The Whiteboard framework is flexible and can be tailored to fit a specific host and audience. At the same time it provides a structure and the resources needed to be successful. The initiative is a grassroots effort with WBCA member coaches volunteering to serve as hosts inviting coaches in the surrounding area to participate. This is a close-to-home and low-cost opportunity for growth and development in leadership.
