Dear member,

We are pleased to share with you this annual report for the 2017-18 WBCA membership year.

The WBCA Board of Directors and staff worked diligently to improve the quantity and quality of services provided to you and we were successful in doing so as reflected in our four major accomplishments this year:

- We restructured membership dues, reducing the cost of membership for those with fewer resources and increasing the cost for those who have more;
- We created a benevolent fund to provide assistance to members who experience a financial hardship through no fault of their own;
- We adopted a revised and simplified code of ethics that will guide how coaches interact with athletes, administrators, officials, fans and each other; and
- We approved a new strategic plan that will chart the path of our association beyond 2020.

Meanwhile, we increased educational programming by expanding the WBCA Coaches' Classroom Regional Whiteboard Series to more sites across the country and began three new programs — "So You Want To Be A HEAD Coach," "XCEL Head Coaches Workshop," and the open practice registry that helps college coaches connect with high school and non-scholastic coaches in their areas and invite them to attend and observe practices.

As much as we have accomplished there remains so much more to do as we help you make yourselves better coaches and elevate our sport to a whole new level!

a new code of ethics to work and live by

The board of directors on March 29, 2018, adopted a revised code of ethics that defines the values and behavioral standards to which the WBCA community of coaches must adhere.

The simplified code consists of a series of bullet points categorized under the WBCA's core values of integrity, athlete experience, education and empowerment, and professionalism, all of which can fit on a single page.

Members must acknowledge they have read and agree to abide by the code as a condition of WBCA membership when they renew. Members should not stand by and watch others violate it.

Member coaches are stewards of the game, conducting themselves with professionalism and integrity, and putting foremost the safety, welfare and educational interests of the women and girls they coach.

The WBCA membership, board of directors and staff conduct themselves in such a manner that the women and girls who play basketball gain self-respect, self-esteem and self-confidence, as well as educational development.

These qualities empower women and girls to succeed in life and to become leaders in their professions, communities and society.

our standards

Integrity

- We follow both the letter and spirit of the rules and regulations that govern our sport.
- We watch for actions that could influence other coaches, staff members, athletes and fans to behave in a way that is contrary to these standards.
- We report conduct or suspected conduct that is not in keeping with these standards as well as the rules and regulations that govern our sport.
- We acknowledge that winning is important, but never at the expense of sportsmanship, safety and integrity.

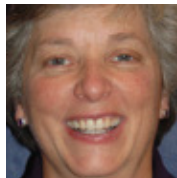

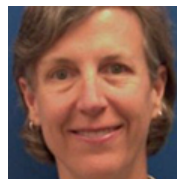

Associations International joins the WBCA team

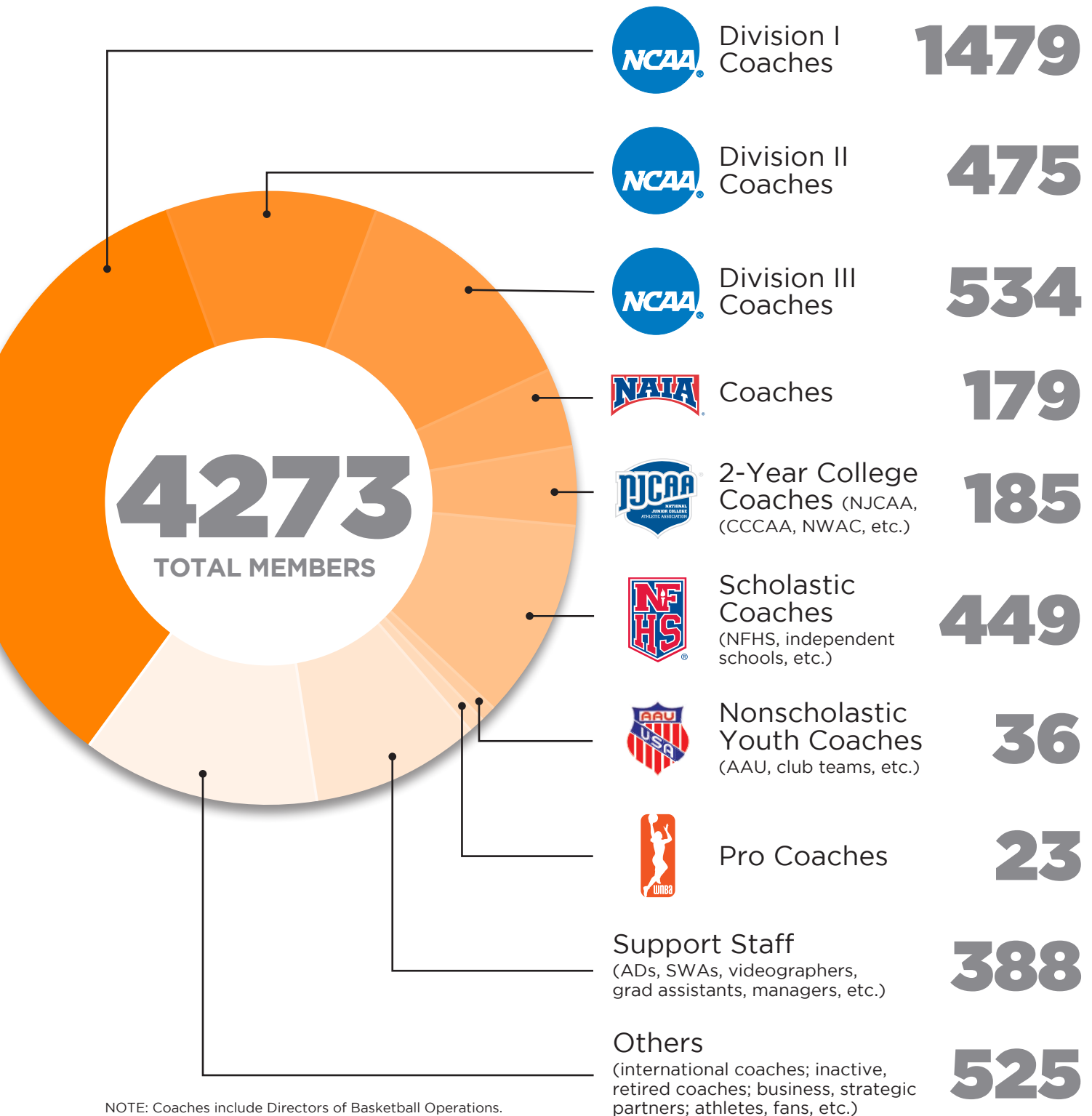

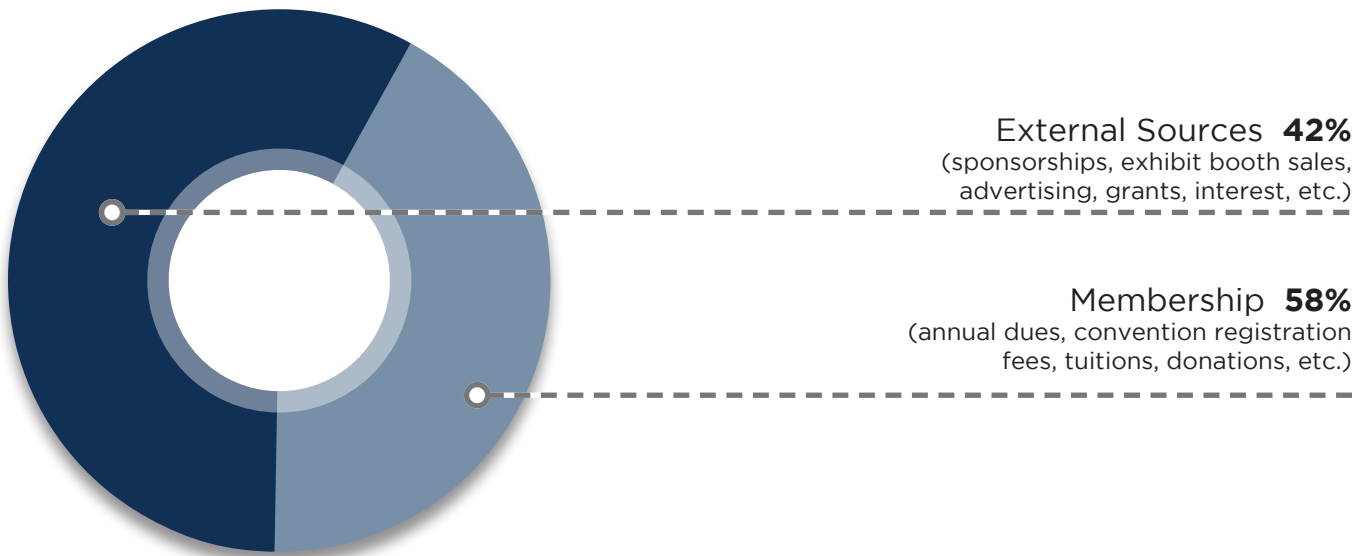

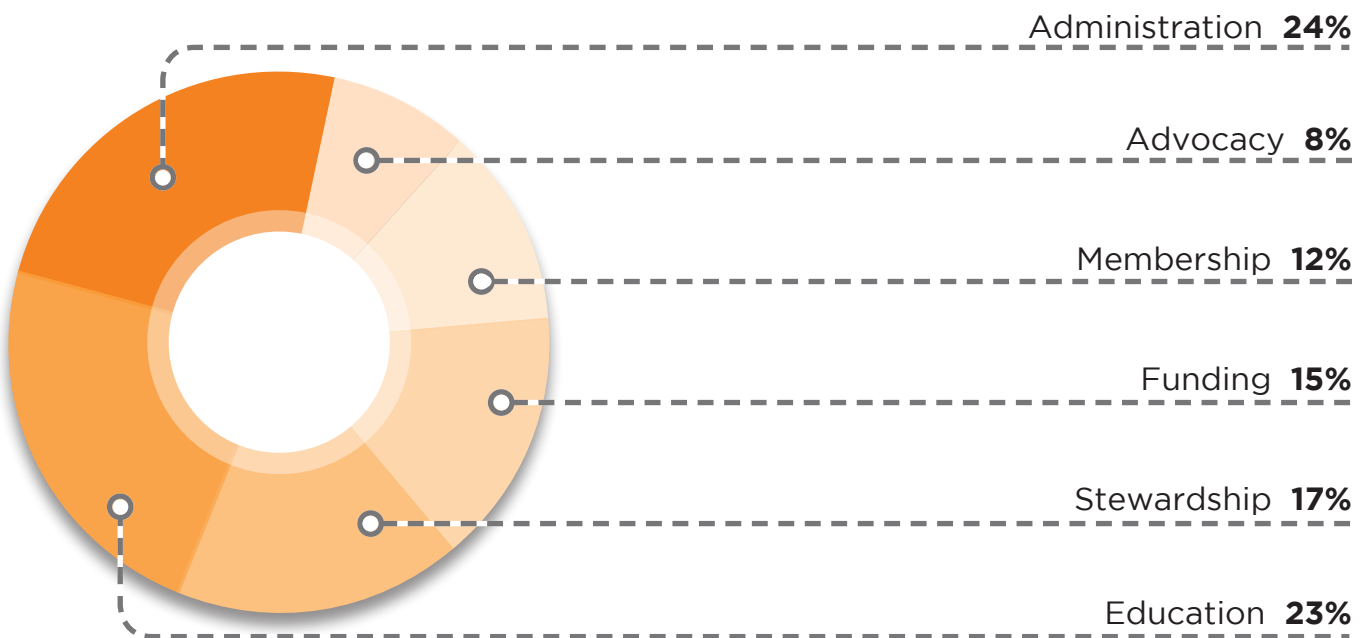


our finances (in 2017-18)

a new fund to help our members in need

The WBCA Board of Directors on March 29, 2018, established a new WBCA Benevolent Fund to assist member coaches who experience financial hardship through no fault of their own. The fund will be seeded through annual contributions by the board from the WBCA's reserves. Individuals may also make tax-deductible donations to the fund.

The fund will be managed by a five-member committee of retired coaches and administrators who will establish guidelines for accepting and reviewing applications for assistance from member coaches. Financial aid may be in the form of grants or loans.

The fund will launch during the 2018-19 membership year.

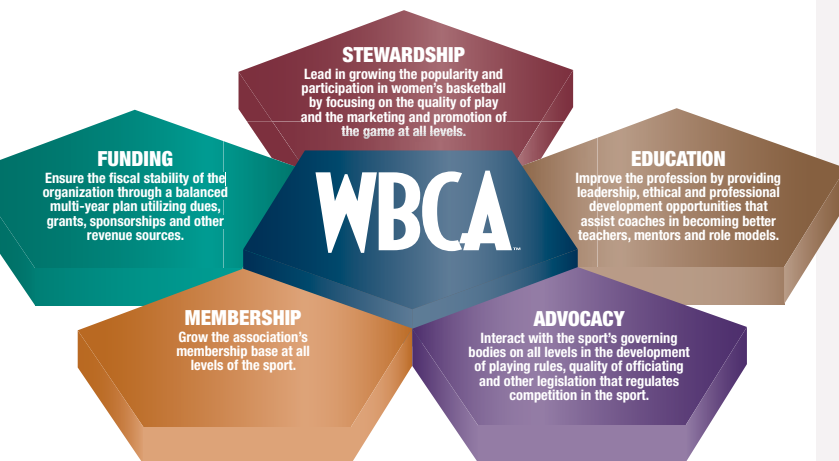


our past success

The WBCA closed out its first-ever strategic plan in 2017-18. The four-year plan, adopted in 2014, consisted of five strategic goals in the areas of stewardship, advocacy, membership, education and funding.

our future strategy



Building on the success of its first strategic plan, the WBCA engaged in a second strategic planning process in Spring 2018. A 20-plus member committee representing all segments of the WBCA membership met for two days in the WBCA office to discuss the association's future.

Because of the rapidly evolving landscapes of collegiate sports and technology, the committee chose to limit its mapping of the WBCA's strategic direction to three years — through 2021.

The committee identified three strategic goals in the areas of stewardship, membership and education with a focus on enhancing marketing efforts to raise awareness of the sport; growing the membership, both domestically

and internationally; and preparing coaches and athletes to be ethical leaders on the playing court and in society. The plan spells out 21
