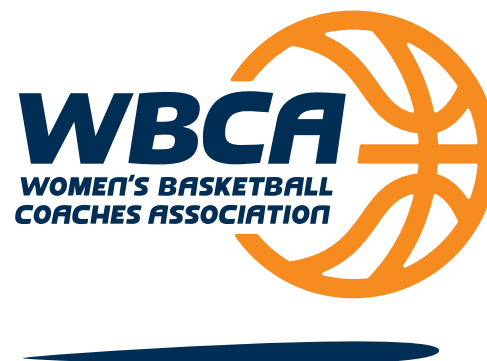


ANNUAL **REPORT** 2018-19



Dear member,

The WBCA Board of Directors and staff are pleased to share with you this annual report for the 2018-19 membership year.

Among our major accomplishments:

- We renewed our focus on marketing and branding, partnering with corporate sponsor Beyond Sports to present the inaugural Women's Collegiate All-Star Game in NCAA Division III.
- We made concerted efforts to promote the value of the WBCA to coaches of the sport and the game as a whole, officially launching the WBCA Benevolent Fund in January. Already the fund has provided more than \$4,000 to member coaches in need of financial assistance. We also expanded the WBCA Conference Captains program, which has been extremely successful through the years in NCAA Divisions I, II and III, to our NAIA membership as well.
- We placed a greater emphasis on our values and standards. The board at its July meeting adopted basic guidelines the executive committee will follow should it become necessary to discipline a member for violating WBCA bylaws or the code of ethics. This policy ensures due process rights of notice, hearing and appeal are protected.

Our efforts are not going unnoticed as our growing membership and record convention attendance show.

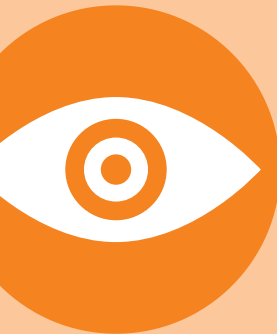
Our Mission

Our Values

Athlete Experience

- We place the physical and mental well-being of the women and girls who play basketball above all else; their health and safety is paramount.
- We maintain strictly professional relationships with the athletes with whom we interact.
- We respect the dignity and individuality of each person with whom we interact and promote a diverse and inclusive culture in which every individual is valued.

Education & Empowerment

- We teach by example and instill in our athletes the fundamental values of honesty, integrity, respect, civility, self-discipline, personal responsibility and fairness.
- We educate women and girls in a manner that prepares them to succeed in life and become leaders in their communities.
- We strive in all we do to expand athlete experiences and support their academic and educational interests.

Professionalism

- We perform with excellence and good sportsmanship and require the same of each other and our athletes.
- We commit to growing and enhancing the sport of women's basketball and seek opportunities to grow personally and professionally.
- We respect the game, fellow coaches, administrators, game officials and the women and girls we coach and teach.
- We conduct ourselves according to the WBCA values and standards and are accountable for our decisions and actions.

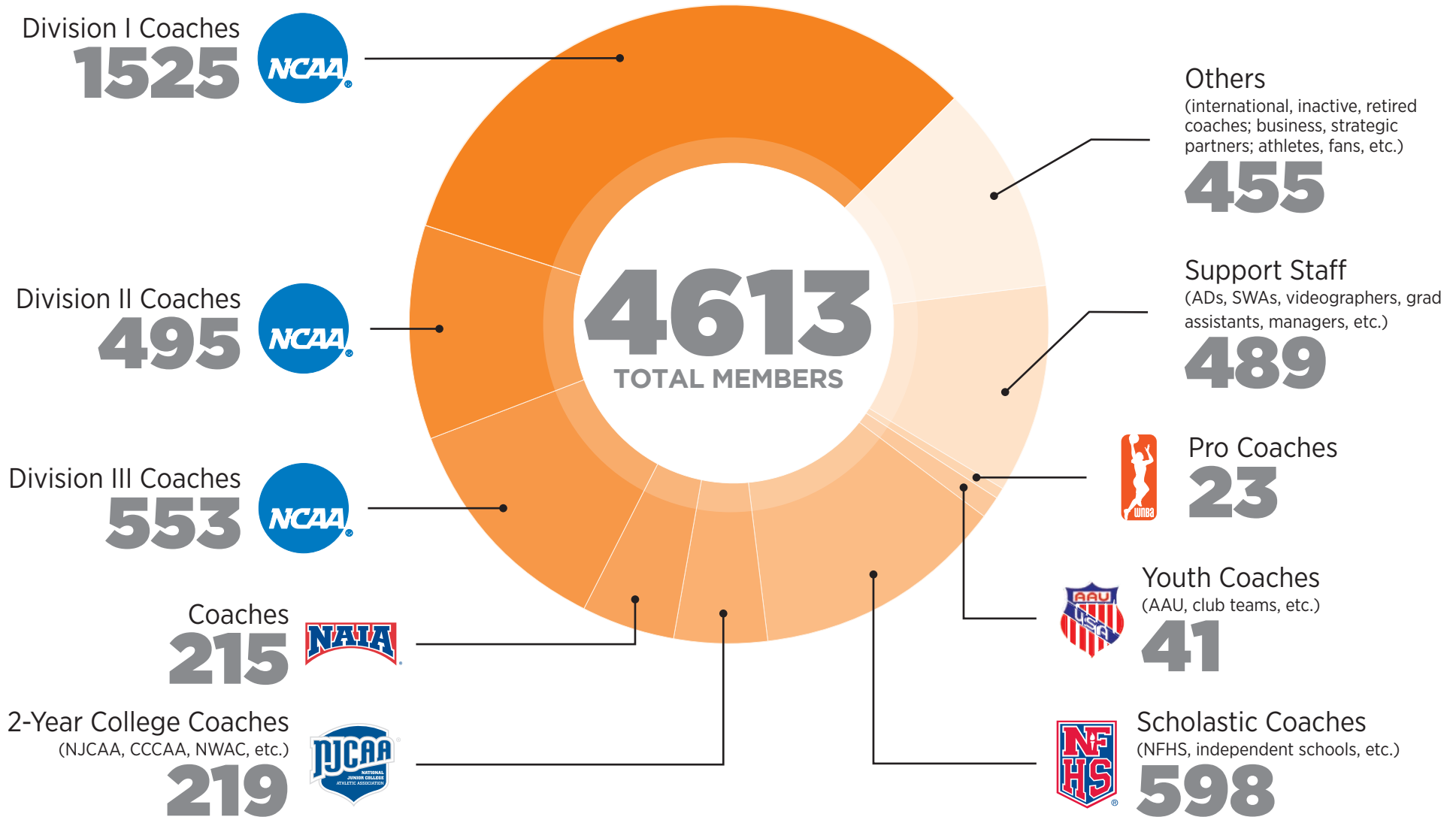

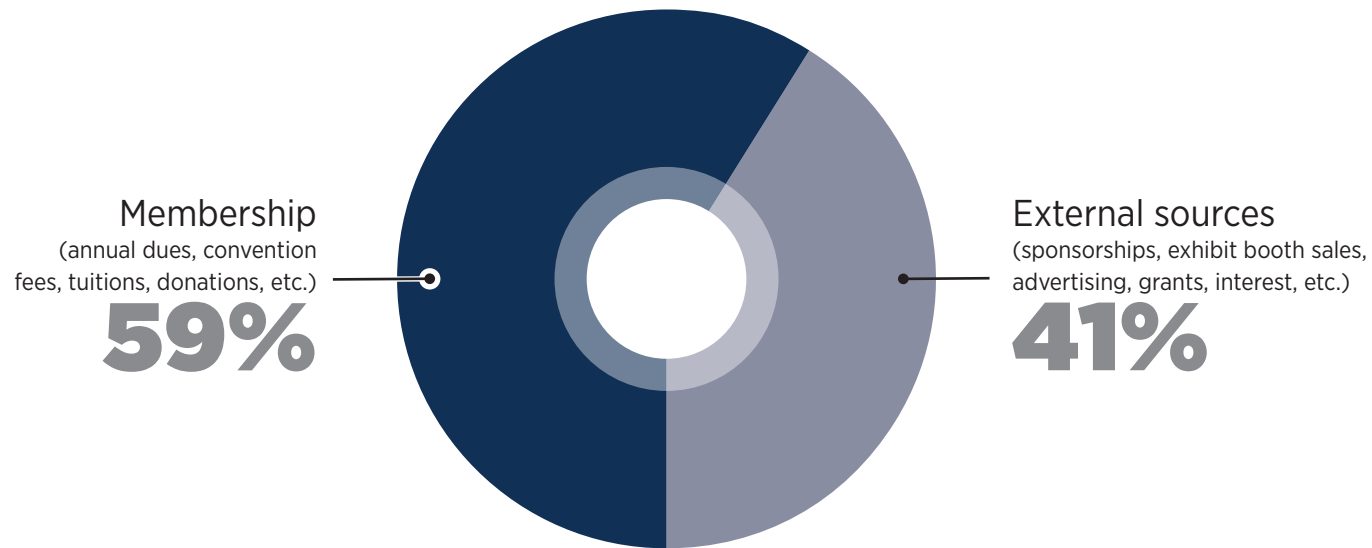

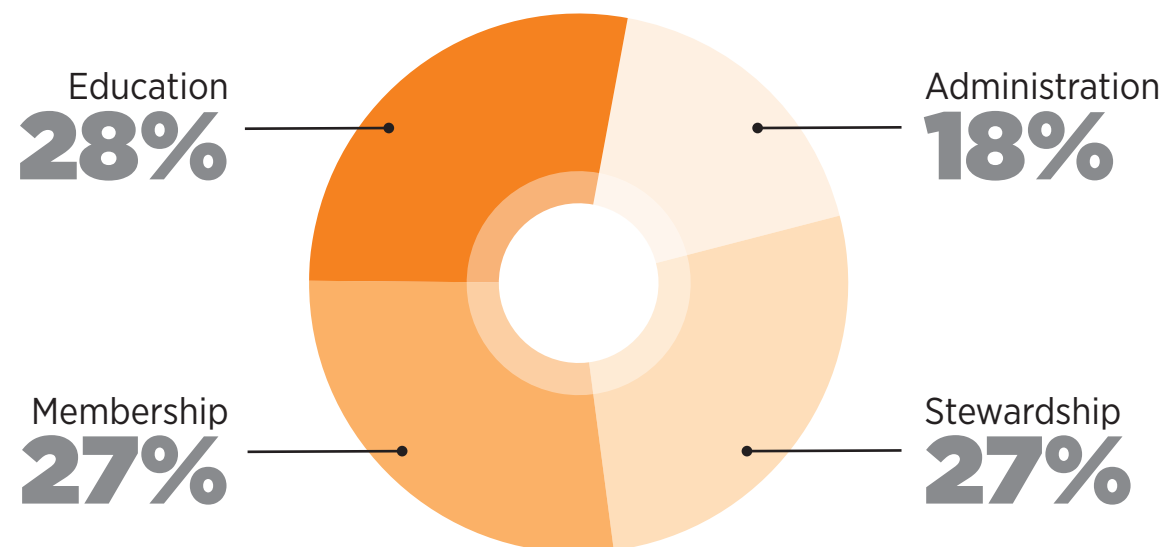
2018-19 budget

Revenue source

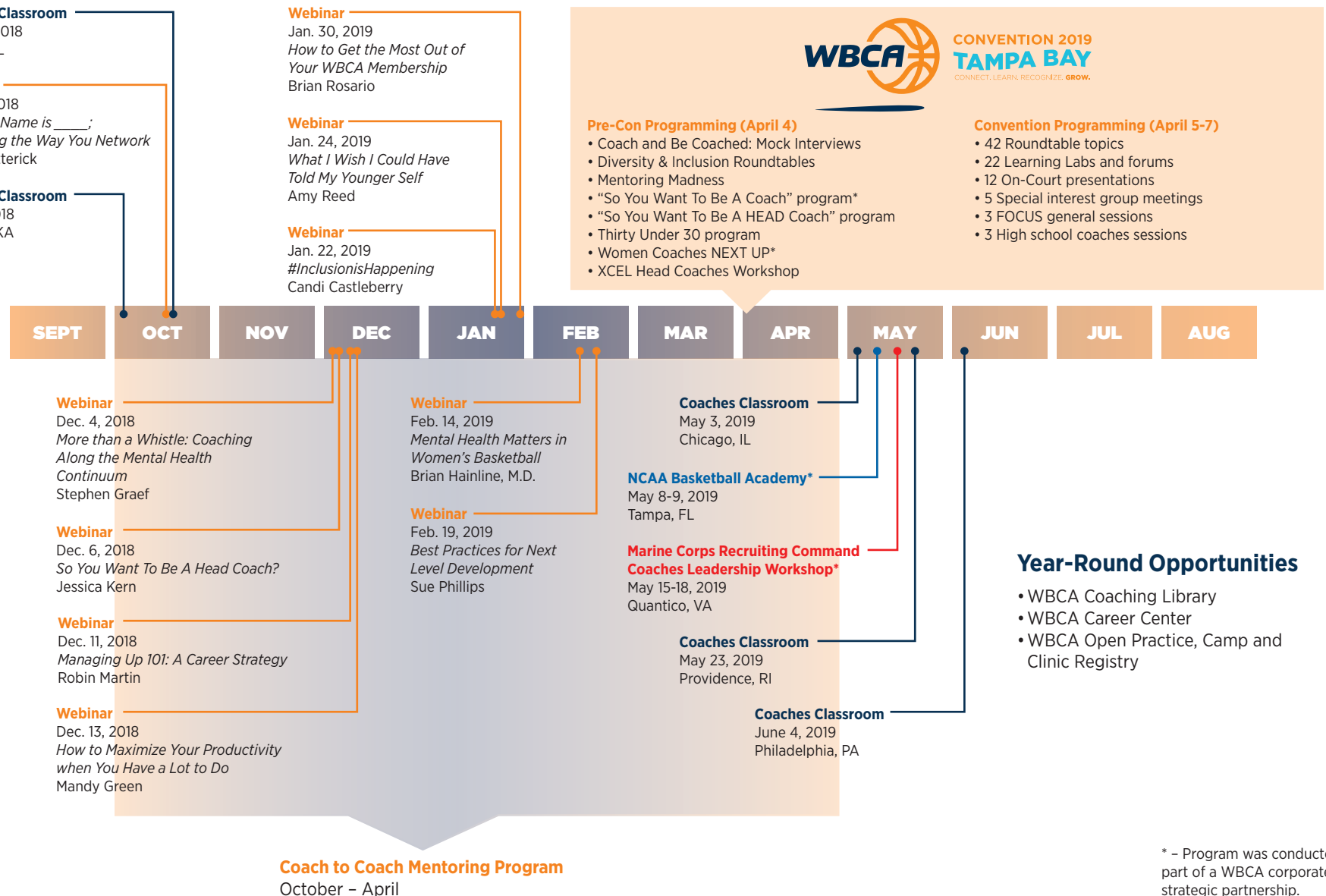


Revenue allocation

Beyond Sports, WBCA partner to launch Women's Collegiate All-Star Game in NCAA Division III

The WBCA partnered with corporate sponsor Beyond Sports to present the *Beyond Sports Women's Collegiate All-Star Game* for NCAA Division III seniors. The inaugural event was played in conjunction with the NCAA Division III Women's Basketball National Championship Game on March 16 in Salem, Virginia. WBCA Benevolent Fund awards more than \$4,000 in assistance in first year of existence

Established by the WBCA Board of Directors in March 2018, the WBCA Benevolent Fund was officially launched in January 2019.

The fund was created to assist member coaches who experience financial hardship through no fault of their own. It is managed by a five-member committee composed of industry professionals, retired coaches and administrators who accept and review applications for assistance from member coaches, and determine if financial assistance is needed and, if so, how much. The fund was seeded through a contribution by the board of directors from the WBCA's reserves. All board members also make personal contributions to the fund. Individuals may make tax-deductible donations to the fund, 100 percent of which is used to benefit member coaches.

In its initial year of operation the fund awarded more than \$4,000 in assistance to member coaches in need.
